## 01 Narrative of Student Monitoring Experiential Learning Plan that Incorporates the Study Abroad Student Learning Outcomes

The Lorenzo de'Medici Study Abroad Program emphasizes the rich history of visual arts and design in Florence, making it unique among the Study Abroad offerings. As Resident Director during your time at LdM, my role is to facilitate your academic growth and to ensure that your performance, attendance, and learning experiences are optimized. As your advisor from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, I will also assist you in resolving any issues regarding academics, cultural adjustment, and recording your final grades.

Throughout your time in Florence, I hope to diversify your learning experience by organizing a series of walking excursions that expose you to the unique cultural and architectural aspects of the city. These walks will each be organized around a theme: gardens and agriculture, piazzas and people, food and markets, and water. Each walk will be accompanied by a 'mapping' assignment and will help you to process the essential learning objectives of the Study Abroad Center:

Each mapping assignment will be recorded in a dedicated sketchbook and can be a verbal or visual interpretation of mapping. At the end of the program we will have an exhibition of your work, which will reveal all of your unique experiences and readings of Florence.

The grades that you receive for the experiential learning portion of your Study Abroad Program will either add or detract from your final course grades, depending on your demonstrated curiosity, critical thinking your, and commitment to the experiential learning assignments.
